Eligibility

- Application must include submission of original research or analysis, program evaluation, or other written or online research resource or materials developed within the last 3 school years.
- Application must be from an active member district of the Council of the Great City Schools.
- Directors of Research, Directors of Assessment or Evaluation, Directors of Accountability, Research Specialists, and other research staff are eligible to apply.
