This professional development and kick-off work session will focus specifically on the work that must be done with district writing teams in order to align selected picture and chapter books by developing text-based questions and providing text-linked activities to these selections in grades K-2. Our goal is to build district capacity for writing text-dependent questions to selected picture and chapter books that would be ready for teachers to use for next school year. Some units may be ready for field testing before the end of the 2013-2014 school year.

The sessions will include focused training on how to analyze the text complexity of a book intended to be read aloud, and how to write good text-dependent questions and design activities to go with selected chapter and picture books Districts will work in teams to develop lessons and come together for feedback sessions whole group.
