In 2013, the Council of the Great City Schools published English Language Learners in America's Great City Schools: Demographics, Achievement and Staffing, an extensive one-of-akind report on English language learner (ELL) programs within its member districts. In April 2019, the Council published an update, primarily covering SY 2013-14 to SY 2016-17.
