The annual meeting of Bilingual, Immigrant, and Refugee Education Directors from the Council's member districts will take place in Baltimore, MD, at the Lord Baltimore Hotel from Tuesday, May 13 through Saturday, May 17. The Council is building a rich and relevant agenda to include:

- Learning sessions addressing the unique needs of particular groups of English learners (e.g., newcomers, older-age, SIFE, long-term ELs, dually-identified, etc.);
- Hands-on work sessions to address specific challenges of practice with guidance from expert thought partners;
- Districtwide English learner program improvement strategies, including implementing supports and monitoring to ensure the quality of dual language programs;
- Approaches to expand English learner access to CTE, Gifted and Talented, and other specialized programs;
