♦When a student is experiencing a challenge, it is OK to ask for help.

Schools have highly trained and skilled professionals in place to support student mental health. Ask for help at school by talking to a: School Behavioral Health Professional School Counselor School Psychologist

♦Co-located Mental Health Professional



Mental health is our ability to live fully, engage with others, and respond to challenges. It is how we relate to others (social). It is how we feel (emotions).

It is how we act (behavior).





Managing the Message

- Stigma arises from a lack of understanding of mental health and mental illness
- We strive to normalize the idea that mental health is very similar to physical health.
 - Everyone has mental health
 - It varies from day to day
 - And just like physical health, you have to take care of it
- Collaboration with stakeholders is key:
 - School Board
 - District Communications Department
 - Other District Departments Food service, Safe Schools, Multicultural Education
 - Community, parent and students
