

Irma Rangel Young Women's Leadership School: Our Story

- Opened in 2004 to create STEM opportunities for minority females
- First all-girls public school in Texas
- Public-private partnership between YWPN and Dallas ISD
- 82% of our Senior class are first generation graduates

- 15 AP Courses: Students take 1-2 AP courses starting freshman year

- ACT/SAT Prep: Privately funded by YWPN with private tutors
- Strong Fine Arts Program for a well-rounded education
- Strong STEM Focused Classes

- Summer AP College Board training for all AP teachers
- 4 AP Institute Readers on campus
- Rigorous ongoing professional development
- Calibration walks





Sisterhood and Wellness: Fostering Student Voice

- NEST Program: Privately funded by YWPN
- Legacy Projects led by our Senior PALS Class
- Traditions:
 - Installation for incoming 6th-grade and new students/staff
 - Crossing Over: Big sister/little sister program (9th and 12th graders)
 - 6th Grade Toolkit: Seniors develop advisory lessons for 6th graders
 - Traditions Week with sisterhood points for participation

Our Impact: Impressive Outcomes

- 100% high school graduation rate since 2009
- 100% four-year college acceptance rate since 2009
- \$24 million in academic and merit scholarship offers for Class of 2024
- 25% of Class of 2024 received full-ride or full-tuition offers
- 98% college enrollment rate (national average for similar schools: 50%)
- 98% 1st to 2nd year college persistence rate (national average: 76%)
- 76% six-year college graduation rate (national average: 25%)
