In 2022, **51% of NYC elementary school students** were not reading proficiently

63% of Latino students were not reading proficiently

64% of Black students were not reading proficiently

The inability to read has far reaching impact:

Students can't access content & fall behind in every subject

Become 4 times more likely to drop out before graduation

Are at increased risk of poverty, incarceration, & poor health

Teachers needed a new playbook.





- In HS, we started building pockets of excellence in comprehensive assessment systems and implementing interventions.




Early progress in NYC Reads shows that aligned effort and collective action can drive real change.

By 2035, all NYCPS students will be thriving readers and writers.

Creating a trajectory changing system takes time.

And, we have more work to do.

The power of NYC Reads isn't tied to one curriculum or practice, but to a shared foundation that enables us to reimagine how we work together across schools, districts, and the entire system.

Superintendents as change-makers

We've learned how to amplify impact by creating the conditions and structures that support superintendent leadership.

Intensive job-embedded support for educators

While we knew support had to be intensive and well-coordinated, we've since learned how to operationalize it: clarifying district roles, providing concrete models and frameworks for providers, and aligning supports across the system.

Our starting point: Common HQIM is the starting line for building system-wide coherence.

Our learning: Build on that foundation with a clear, crisp, shared vision that gives superintendents the space to simplify and drives coherence across the system.


Citywide NYC Reads Instructional Focus

Eyes on Text: All students reading, discussing, and writing to make meaning of challenging texts every day.

NYC Reads brings rich, challenging, grade-level texts into every classroom, so all students grow to be proficient readers. To achieve this, we need to build student independence and ensure access to these texts. As part of a robust Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), we provide scaffolds to ensure that all students meet grade-level outcomes. When students struggle to read grade-level texts independently, we address this "readability gap" by using evidence-based instructional practices, such as explicit instruction and small group instruction.

Our starting point: We needed to build district team capacity to lead and own systemic change in literacy instruction. Our early structures were simple—monthly meetings for literacy leads.

Our learning: Build vertical and horizontal collaboration and create differentiated strands to address all NYC Reads components.
