


Columbus, Ohio is one of the fastest growing cities in the U.S. and emerging as the tech center of the Midwest.

EVOLUTION OF A PARTNERSHIP

The City of Columbus Department of Building and Zoning Services (BZS) partnered with Fort Hayes Career Center to create opportunities for students entering the construction trades field. The students are exposed to trained professionals who previously worked in the industry and are now certified inspectors.

IDENTIFY the need:

- Sharp decline in the number of young people entering the construction trades
- Local economic boom exacerbating the need for construction workers
- Decline in the number of new inspectors entering the field

COLLABORATE with key stakeholders:

- Met with BZS to discuss current trends and explore partnership opportunities
- District team and BZS to align curriculum and student experiences

EXECUTE assemble the working group:

Work together to design, recruit, and implement the partnership plan
