# 8:30 am - 9:30 am Making the Invisible, Visible

**GRAND BALLROOM** 

This session will frame and set the tone for BIRE 2023. EL program directors and staff ensure that English learners and multilingual students are visible within school district ecosystems, providing them equal access to the curriculum and educational initiatives. Equity-focused work means seeing beyond broad categories, examining in a nuanced way the assets and needs of the heterogeneous English learner and immigrant student communities to create responsive programs and initiatives. Council staff will share examples of data analyses that reveal unique assets and needs. Educators from Austin ISD and the District of Columbia Public Schools will guide participants through a case study of the current landscape and shared experiences of Asian American/Pacific Islander (AAPI) students and educators that underscores the importance of understanding in nuanced ways the demographics of EL and immigrant-origin populations. This nuanced understanding of richly heterogeneous multilingual communities is vital for making sure that ALL are visible within the educational system.

Participants will learn how three districts are implementing SEL programs and services that are responsive to the unique needs of refugees and other recently arrived students and families. Houston ISD will describe how its SEL services and programs meet the unique needs of refugee students. Austin ISD will describe its processes for SEL-focused communication with families as well as the guidance provided to front office staff, teachers, and administrators to welcome recently arrived families. **GRAND BALLROOM** 

Baltimore City Schools will describe its latest strategies developed and implemented over the last five years to increase EL access to gifted and advanced learning (GAL) programs, supports, and services. Systemic shifts in how and when universal screening occurs and increased collaboration between the ESOL and GAL offices have significantly increased the identification of ELs in the district's tiers of GAL programming. Omaha Public Schools will discuss its progress toward identifying more ELs for GATE through collaboration with the Nebraska Department of Education and the National Center for Gifted Research. Pinellas County Schools will describe an enrichment STEM summer camp that breaks the cycle of remediation and sets ELs on a path to acceleration and increased representation in gifted and talented programs. Pinellas will also describe how ESOL teachers are paired with gifted teachers, leading to an exchange of knowledge, experiences, language, and friendship during the summer STEM camp.

MAKING THE INVISIBLE VISIBLE USING STUDENT, SCHOOL, AND DISTRICT DATA

**GRAND BALLROOM** 

Rebecca Callahan will present findings on the K-16 trajectories of ever-English learners from a recent longitudinal study using a large data set of English learners in Texas. Participants will learn about positive findings, such as higher-than-anticipated graduation rates of high school ever-ELs, as well as findings about persistent challenges, such as lower actual college-going rates. Guilford County Schools will share the findings and new insights that emerged from the district's deep dive into its long-term EL data, showing the value of making long-term EL data visible to better inform targeted responses to meet the specific needs of long-term ELs revealed by the data.

# **EFFECTIVE ENGAGEMENT OF EL AND IMMIGRANT FAMILIES**

GRAND BALLROOM

Austin ISD will share its best practices, including working with community organizations, to support effective communication and engagement with recently arrived refugee and newcomer families. St. Paul Public Schools will share details about its *family coach* position to coordinate community partners to support students and their families. Family coaches receive academic support training in addition to trauma-informed professional development. Participants will also learn about St. Paul's partnership with the state's Department of Human Service Office of Refugee Resettlement to help connect students and their families with cash assistance, healthcare, tutoring services, and other state programs. Denver Public Schools will share its initiatives to engage and connect with families of multilingual learners. Participants will learn about Community Hubs, Family Engagement and Empowerment Committees, Parent Advisory Committees, and MLE District Advisory Committees that build authentic relationships with immigrant and refugee families and students, elevate family voices, and connect families to resources that empower and enhance family advocacy skills in support of their child's education.

CGCS will guide an interactive review of the findings from the Council's newcomers and SIFE/SLIFE survey to examine the trends about concerns related to meeting the needs of newcomer students. Minneapolis Public Schools will share its efforts working with partner agencies to welcome and support the more than 1,100 newcomers arriving in SY 2022-23. Participants will learn about advocacy efforts to access district resources and the specialized professional development and instructional support geared to staff and school leaders to support newcomer students. New York City Public Schools will detail its *Stand Alone English as a New Language* (ENL) model to provide multilingual learners with access to grade-level text in all their classrooms. Participants will hear about how the district is creating spaces where newcomer MLLs feel safe and comfortable to grapple with these texts during the dedicated English language development period.
