Atlanta Schools Superintendent Wins Top Urban Education Award

WASHINGTON, Nov. 1 Atlanta Public Schools Superintendent Beverly Hall recently received the 2006 Richard R. Green Award, the nation s highest honor for urban education leadership, at the Council of the Great City Schools 50th Annual Fall Conference.

Eleven superintendents of big-city school systems competed for the top award for an urban educator.

The award is given each year by the Council, a coalition of the nation's largest urban public school districts, and ARAMARK, a food and facility services company. The Green Award is named for the first African American chancellor of the New York City school system.

Under Dr. Hall s leadership, the Atlanta Public Schools has closed the achievement gap with the State of Georgia, lowered the dropout rate, reduced the number of teacher vacancies and consolidated the Atlanta district s 99 schools to 88, renovating 46 of them into state-of-the-art facilities.

As the recipient of the Green Award, Dr. Hall received a \$10,000 college scholarship to present to a high school senior of her choice in the Atlanta Public Schools.
