**Boston Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- Distance Learning to continue during the closure

**Bridgeport Public Schools:** Schools closed until May 18

**March 23:** Distance Learning Phase 1 began. The goal is to provide support for students as they access paper and/or electronic resources.

**April 1-** Phase 2 Begins. Students encouraged to submit completed student work from Phase 1 to the distance learning portal. Instructional videos on website to assist families.

**Broward County Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Saturday March 28<sup>th</sup>:** Learning Devices Distributed

- Laptops distributed at select locations on first-serve basis

**Monday March 30<sup>th</sup>:** Distance Learning begins for all students

- Documents on how to access resources also provided

**Buffalo Public Schools:** Schools closed until May 15

**Thursday March 19<sup>th</sup>:** District distributes learning materials to students

- Used over 100 buses to pass out learning materials throughout the city to students to use for distance learning
- Given to 7,000 elementary students
- Distance learning materials will be provided through the closure even during scheduled April break

**Charleston County School District:** Schools closed through the end of April

**Friday March 24<sup>th</sup>:** Device exchanges begin

- The district will use the bus network to establish locations for device exchange from the IT department
- 15 schools will offer outdoor WiFi access to students who need internet to complete distance learning activities

**Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools:** Schools closed through May 15

**March 19 – 27**

- Remote learning tools distributed and delivery of necessary materials to students
- Non digital packet for K-3 and digital resources for 4-12 students

**Chicago Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**April 13- Remote learning began**

- Earlier this week, we announced our Pre-K–12 remote learning plan to keep our students engaged, learning, and connected to their school community during the closure.
- Remote learning assignments and activities will only improve student grades. Our aim is to increase learning, not to negatively impact our students during school closures.
- The district will be distributing more than 100,000 devices to help narrow the digital divide during this period.

**Cincinnati Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- Launched the Remote Learning Plan with Enrichment Learning Packets distributed at all 23 meal sites on April 13.
- Grade-level packets are available to students and families who do not have access to online learning
- Cincinnati Public Schools is launching CPS TV beginning April 20. The community access channel will feature recorded online lessons presented by CPS teachers, along with other educational programming from zoos, libraries and museums.
- Cincinnati Public Schools' seniors who need computers to do schoolwork can pick up devices on Wednesday, April 22, 2020.

**Clark County School District:** Schools closed through April 30

- During the timeframe in which the schools in the Clark County School District (CCSD) are closed, student learning extension opportunities are provided for all students. These student learning extension opportunities provide activities for students to engage in learning at home. Directions for the student learning extension activities are provided in both English and Spanish. As every school community is unique, schools may choose to have additional options for distance education, which may include, but are not limited to, Google Classroom; Canvas; and other school-site platforms currently used at individual schools, as existing log-in access exists for most students.
- Student learning extension activities accessible through pencil and paper provide opportunities for students to practice concepts and skills at home. Directions for the student learning extension activities are provided in both English and Spanish. The student learning extension activities are also available at food deployment locations throughout the Las Vegas valley.

**Cleveland Metropolitan School District:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Tuesday April 14<sup>th</sup>: Enrichment Learning Packets distributed**

- New academic enrichment learning packets to keep students actively engaged in learning during the extended school closure are available at our 22 meal sites and for download from the District's website.
- We will soon be mailing these learning packets directly to homes as well. Please note that, in addition to the learning packets, we are distributing Lakeshore Learning kits for grades PreK-5 and will soon have novels available for our middle and high school students.

**Columbus City Schools:** School closed remainder of the school year

- Beginning on Monday, April 6, CCS will transform into a virtual learning organization with all of our educational resources and school-related activities available through the new Columbus City Schools Online Academy.

**Dallas Independent School District:** Schools closed until further notice

**Tuesday March 24<sup>th</sup>:** Devices provided to secondary students

- Dallas ISD is providing devices for all middle and high school students to participate in at-home learning while the district remains closed to help slow the spread of the coronavirus in our community.

**Monday April 6<sup>th</sup>:** Update to the technological resources provided by the districts

- Over 83,000 devices provided to students since district closure
- Over 9,000 mobile hot spots provided with an additional 10,000 being ordered and 5,000 being donated from the McDermott Family Foundation.

**Denver Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Tuesday April 7<sup>th</sup>:** Computer Pickup for K-12 Students

- If your student still needs a computer, you can pick one up on Wednesday, April 8 between 10:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. Computer pickup is now available to students in grades K-12 on a first-come, first-served basis at 12 DPS schools that we're using for technology distribution.

**Des Moines Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- Des Moines Public Schools will complete the 2019-20 school year through distance learning, beginning next week for high school seniors, April 20 for other high school grades, and April 27 for all other students.
- The school district has been surveying and contacting all students and families about their access to computers and/or the internet at home.
- Computer and/or internet connections will be distributed to high school seniors later this week, with distance learning beginning on Monday, April 13.
- Distribution of computers and/or internet connections to students in other grade levels will begin next week.
- Distance learning will begin on Monday, April 20 for students in grades 9-11.
- Distance learning will begin on Monday, April 27 for students in grades PK-8.

**Detroit Public Schools Community District:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- Schools will be moving to a distance learning model. We will engage our students virtually and through printed academic packets that will be available at the 17 food distribution sites.
- Our district staff has been working hard since school was closed to develop a new learning framework that will offer learning opportunities for PreK-12 students in literacy, mathematics, science and social studies. This will include lessons for physical education and art as well. Learning will build from the curriculum our students are currently using with linked videos introducing learning concepts and assignments. The printed packets will be available the week of April 20th.
- The district is actively working with the business community to implement a strategy to provide all DPSCD families with a tablet and internet access.

**District of Columbia Public Schools:** Schools will remain closed and students will participate in learning at home through the end of the school year on May 29

- DCPS prepared printed packets of learning materials for every grade level from Pre-K through 8th grade and each graduation requirement course for 9-12th grade.
- These activities will continue classroom learning at home and engage students during a period of school closure.
- These instructional materials were designed to meet the needs of all students including English Learners and students with special needs.
- DCPS families can pick up hard copies of distance learning printed materials at their school on designated days when notified by DCPS

**Duval County Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**March 20<sup>th</sup>: Duval Homeroom Launches**

- Duval HomeRoom webpage is scheduled to launch Sunday evening.
- This site will include links and learning materials students will need, instructions for families, and bus route information telling families where they can go to get the educational materials and school lunch.

**March 21<sup>st</sup>: Devices distributed to students**

- Laptop distribution began today with high school students and will continue through to at least the end of next week. By the end of this process, we expect to distribute about 25,000 devices.

- Eligible families who completed the survey will be contacted directly with specific instructions for when and where to pick up technology.

**Fort Worth Independent School District:** Schools closed until further notice

**Monday March 30<sup>th</sup>:** Learning Enrichment Program Orientation Begins

- The week of March 30<sup>th</sup> is an orientation week, a time for students, their families, and teachers to make every effort to transition to Learning at Home, the online, teacher-guided learning experience that begins in April.
- Amid ongoing school closures to curb the coronavirus, the District, for the first time ever, is putting curricula online and training all teachers to instruct virtually.

**Guilford County Schools:**

- School closure should not keep students from learning. GCS educators have developed and cataloged online resources that students can use to continue learning while schools are closed.
- GCS now has 16 locations where families can access the internet from the parking lot.

**Hillsborough County Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**March 23<sup>rd</sup> to March 27<sup>th</sup>:** Launch of eLearning Program

- Dubbed “Set Up for Success Week”
- Uploaded Resource Plan for Art, Music, and PE
- All content for teachers uploaded on Clever

**Houston Independent School District:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- The district will continue to utilize [HISD @ H.O.M.E.](#) (Home-based Online Mobile Education), a distance learning plan to ensure students’ academic and non-academic needs are met. Students and parents can access the site on their school’s main landing page by clicking on the HISD @ H.O.M.E. icon or by visiting the site at: [HoustonISD.org/HOME](https://HoustonISD.org/HOME). Campuses also have been instructed to provide paper-based curriculum resources to provide to families without access to technology.

- The district launched the HISD @ H.O.M.E. Hotline to help answer parent and student questions. The hotline — 713-556-INFO (4636) — is available Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Operators are on hand to answer questions in English, Spanish, Vietnamese, and Arabic.
- HISD will also continue to support distance learning efforts with HISD @ H.O.M.E. TV. Educational lessons are produced in English and Spanish and are broadcast on HISD-TV (Comcast Channel 18 and Uverse Channel 99), as well as online via [HoustonISD.org/LiveTV](https://HoustonISD.org/LiveTV).

**Indianapolis Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Thursday, April 9th: IPS launches home learning plan**

- Home Learning plan begins
- Indianapolis Public Schools and Circle City Broadcasting, owner of WISH-TV and MyINDY-TV 23, have formed a partnership to broadcast academic lessons to IPS students in Grades K–8 five days a week. The lessons will start airing from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. Monday–Friday on MyINDY-TV 23, beginning April 27.

**Jefferson County Public Schools:** Schools closed through May 1

**Tuesday April 7<sup>th</sup>: District begins I Non-Traditional instruction (NTI)**

- We have developed an online [portal](#) with educational activities and hands-on projects to keep students engaged outside of their classrooms. Our portal has age appropriate tasks for every grade level.
- Offering chrome books through a reservation system
- Also working to provide additional internet access to students who need it

**Kansas City Public Schools (MO):** Schools will now remain closed through the last day of classes on May 20, 2020

- Distribution of grade-level packets for students
- Will be lending district-owned devices (Apple iPads or Google Chromebooks) to students in grades K-8. High school students already have laptop computers that they are allowed to take home.

**Thursday April 9<sup>th</sup>: Message from the Superintendent**

- We plan to transition to fully digital classwork and we will be ramping up this instruction. Teachers will begin (or have already begun) using our virtual tools – such as Google Classroom, Seesaw and Classroom Dojo – for their classes. In order to continue making this transition, we will be launching an initiative to ensure that every household has a Chromebook laptop computer and Wi-Fi Internet access. Our plan is to rollout Chromebooks and hot spots for our students in grades K-8 throughout the remainder of April.

#### **Thursday March 12<sup>th</sup>: Local Stations provide educational content to students**

- Los Angeles Unified, PBS SoCal | KCET, and KLCS-TV have partnered to provide free supplemental educational resources to help your family support learning during the school closures. This multi-platform initiative includes Pre-K–12 educational programming and robust online resources through the online platform PBS LearningMedia. The resources are free and designed to be used by public schools throughout California to help students continue learning at home.

**Manchester School District:** Schools are closed through at least May 4

- Distributed more than 110,000 computer devices
- Provided professional development to 18,000 teachers
- 30,000 live video lessons a day

**Milwaukee Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Wednesday April 1st: Plan for Online Learning**

- Milwaukee Public Schools will provide new printed instructional materials at the 20 Stop, Grab, and Go locations throughout the city and will continue to provide digital materials on the district webpage.
- Device Distribution to continue on April 16<sup>th</sup>

**New York City Department of Education:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**March 22: Remote Learning Announced**

**March 30<sup>th</sup>: Packet distribution begins**

- Activity packets mailed to students grades K-5
- iPad distribution begins for students
- Regional Enrichment Centers available to students with parents of first responders and healthcare workers
- To keep students connected and meeting academic requirements when learning remotely, the NYCDOE has created student accounts for every student. The account gives you access to Google Classroom and Microsoft Office 365.
- Every student who has requested an internet-enabled device will have one by the end of April.
- We'll provide 1:1 counseling support to every senior, working closely with schools and families to understand if students are on track—and if not, provide opportunities to help them get there. Guidance counselors from every high school will reach out to every senior to make sure they are on a path to graduate.

**Norfolk Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- Phase II of the Learning in Place plans by grade level is now available and exposes students to new instructional material.

- For families who do not have access to the Internet, paper copies of Learning in Place plans will be available Monday, Wednesday and Friday at one of the “grab-and-go meal” distribution sites for students

**Oklahoma City Public Schools:** Last day of school is May 8th

**April 6th: OKCPS moves to distance learning**

- The Continuous Learning Plan (CLP) has two options for student learning: online through our OKCPS website by grade level or via Instructional Packets (paper/hardcopies) by grade level
- Paper copies of the Instructional Packets will be available for our families to pick-up at any of our meal sites each week on Mondays and Tuesdays
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**Orange County Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- From March 30 forward, PreK-12 students will begin *teacher-facilitated* distance learning. Your child's teacher will communicate the specifics.
- Offline options are available for elementary, ESE and ELL students, as needed.

**Pinellas County Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Pittsburg Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- Distribution of technology to identified 12th-grade students. All 12th grade students needing technology should have received a call from their child’s principal to outline pick-up locations and student expectations.

- Student orientation for all students

**Portland Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

- PPS-HD is a distance learning plan to support students' academic and social-emotional needs. It aligns with guidance from the Oregon Department of Education and provides for blended learning strategies and access to educational materials through multiple modes, such as virtual classroom and paper learning guides.
- The PPS-HD plan includes curriculum by grade level and subject matter that is designed to maintain instruction and academic engagement for students using computers, laptops, tablets, iPads or smartphones.
- **What's needed:** Students need two things: An internet-compatible device and. Access to the internet. To-date, we have been able to loan over 6,000 computers to students.

**Rochester City School District:** School closure through May 15

**April 6:** The District will provide a chromebook if needed to any students in grades 6-12 who has not yet received one this school year.

- Age and grade level appropriate educational resources are available on the District's website at RCSD Learns
- Weekly instructional materials for K –8th-grade students are available online and packets of those materials will continue to be delivered to our food sites. Online instructional materials will continue to be available for our 9th-12th-grade students.

**Sacramento City Unified School District:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Friday April 3<sup>rd</sup>: Distance Learning Technology**

- Distributed 3,500 computers to students
- Rush-order of 20,000 more computers to further provide technology to students who need them

**April 13<sup>th</sup>: Distance Learning begins**

- First week will focus on reestablishing connections between teachers and students
- Reestablishing these connections is an important part of distance learning – and ensures that families are able to get the information they need to be successful.

**San Diego Unified School District**

**April 6<sup>th</sup>: Distance Learning Soft Launch- Distribution of Laptops begins**

**April 27- Formal Launch of Distance Learning**

- Three Distance Learning Models: District-Provided Instructional Materials with Educator Support, Educator-led Hybrid Instruction, Blended Instruction

- We have distributed more than 8,600 Chromebooks to students so far and are continuing to deploy devices the week of April 13!

- Teachers of students in 3rd grade through 12th grade also began teaching lessons on Monday, April 13--mostly online.
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**Seattle Public Schools:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**Monday April 13<sup>th</sup>: Distance learning devices distributed**

- Continued through Spring Break at select locations
- During this extended school building closure, school districts are expected to provide continuous learning to students. According to the Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction (OSPI), the term "continuous learning" means establishing and maintaining connections with students and families to provide learning materials and supports using a variety of modalities

**Monday April 13<sup>th</sup>: New partnership with Discovery Learning**

- "Today, we announced a major partnership with Discovery Education to make an amazing new virtual learning platform available to our students and teachers for free. Discovery Education Experience is packed with over 190,000 activities and resources for K-12 students, all based on core curriculum concepts and popular topics in Math, Science, Social Studies, English/Language Arts and Health."

**The School District of Philadelphia:** Schools closed remainder of the school year

**April 20:** The district implemented its formal digital learning plan, which begins with two weeks of enrichment and review.

**May 4:** Teachers will provide three hours per day of planned instruction via Google Classroom.

**Tuesday April 14<sup>th</sup>: District Updates**

- The School District of Philadelphia has officially launched a digital learning webpage, making the suite of learning resources it has created to support learning from home publicly available to all District families,
- The [webpage](#) includes digital learning materials and lesson plans in all subject areas for students in Pre-Kindergarten through 12th grade as well as activities for career and technical education, physical education, visual and performing arts and world languages. New materials are added each week for the upcoming week of instruction.
- The District will provide a Chromebook to every student who needs one for learning at home
- Student attendance will also officially be taken and digital learning on new material will begin with assignments graded by teachers.

**Tulsa Public Schools:**

**April 6-10: Student Learning Packets**

- Starting on Monday, April 20, families of students in pre-kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade can pick up their second printed learning packets at all Tulsa Public Schools [grab-and-go meal sites](#) for students who are not working online. These packets will have two weeks of at-home learning content.
- Starting Monday, April 13, Tulsa Public Schools will provide educational television programming on the district's TPS20 Cox channel and RSU-TV to support distance learning for students in grades pre-kindergarten through 8th.
